## DIGGING DEEPER

(For use in personal/family devotions or with your care group.)

- Q1: Zig Ziglar said- "Every job is a self-portrait of the person who did it." Do you agree or disagree with this statement? Why?
- Q2: Read I Sam. 15:1-23. What does this story teach about doing God's work God's way?
- Q3: How do you normally react/respond when something you are working on doesn't turn out the way you hoped? How might the Lord want you to respond in a more productive way?
- Q4: Read I Chronicles 15:1-2, 11-13, Exodus 25:10-15. How did God's Word change David's methodology in moving the Ark the second time?
- Q5: How does the world wrongly assign significance to the standards of "majority, new and enthusiasm/sincerity when it comes to doing something "right"?
- Q6: What do this passage teach you about abandoning safety and taking a risk for the Lord? Farmers who wait for perfect weather never plant. If they watch every cloud, they never harvest. Just as you cannot understand the path of the wind or the mystery of a tiny baby growing in its mother's womb, so you cannot understand the activity of God, who does all things. Plant your seed in the morning and keep busy all afternoon, for you don't know if profit will come from one activity or another—or maybe both. (Ecclesiastes 11:4-6)
