Q1: It has been said that it is always easier to get into something than out of something. Do you agree/disagree? Explain.

Q2: Read II Timothy 3:14-17. How do these verses emphasize that God's Word is more important than our words?

Q3: What do you think of the following quote on worship by A.W. Tozer?

"Worship is to feel in your heart and express in some appropriate manner a humbling but delightful sense of admiring awe and astonished wonder and overpowering love in the presence of that most ancient Mystery, that Majesty which philosophers call the First Cause, but which we call Our Father Which Are in Heaven."

Q4: Read Psalm 95. What does this passage teach you about worship and about listening? Q5: What preparations do you make before coming to worship the Lord? What kinds of new things could you do to better prepare yourself to praise the Lord and hear from Him? Q6: Read Proverbs 13:12. What does this very teach us about promise keeping?
