1) Those who ______. (vs. 16-17)

Judgers will try to rule you by...

- Their standards (vs. 16)
- Their truths (vs. 17a)
- Their realities (vs. 17b)

Q6: Read Galatians 5:1. Have you ever come close to being "burdened again by a yoke of slavery," and losing your gospel freedom? How did this happen? What lessons can you draw from this experience?
